#### 2. Committee Reports

### A. Cultural Center

Trustee Roman reported that the air conditioning unit has not yet been installed in the downstairs room of the Cultural Center.

#### B. Buildings and Parks

Trustee Banks reported on the vandalism at Burgess Meredith Park in the children's playground area. Pins were removed from the rubber border around the play area and rubber edging was removed.

Discussion was held concerning a grant for the purpose of purchasing a truck for the Village. It was decided not to purchase a truck but to add the monthly cleanup of Camp Hill, Call Hollow, New Pomona, Pomona, Ladentown and Quaker Roads to the annual landscape contract. A volunteer would be needed to track the roads designated for clean-up and when it needs to be done.

Further revision to the tree law is planned for discussion at the next workshop.
